# **Adur Special Needs Project**

We were delighted to be one of the headline sponsors at this year's Shoreham Star Trail. This wonderful annual event includes a fun character hunt and raises vital funds for Adur Special Needs Project, which runs play schemes for local children with special educational needs and disabilities.



#### Baby2baby

This lovely charity provides children and baby clothing to families in East Sussex. Our donation supported their Santa Baby campaign, providing 250 toys and gifts for local children who may otherwise go without.

#### **Brighton Pebbles**

This amazing charity is run by parent carers for children with any disability – with a focus on children who find it difficult to access mainstream activities. Once again, our funding helped enable families to have a well-deserved holiday at the Kench Hill Activity Centre.

#### **Chanctonbury Community Playscheme**

Every summer for the last 46 years, Worthingbased CCPS has offered a fun-packed programme of activities and trips for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). This summer, the charity supported over 90 families across West Sussex with a range of in-house activities - from arts and crafts and a sensory zone to go-karting and the annual CCPS water fight.







#### Children With Cancer Fund

This wonderful charity aims to grant wishes and hold exciting events for families in East Sussex, Brighton and Hove with children who have/have had cancer. We continue to proudly provide funding for the many activities and treats they offer.



#### **Christmas Wishes**

We're pleased to be donating Christmas gifts to this community-run scheme, which has been supporting vulnerable, sick and disadvantaged children and their families in Burgess Hill, Hassocks, Hurstpierpoint and Haywards Heath since 2013. The gifts will be given to the children supported by this wonderful charity.



#### **Extratime**

We supported a Family Fun Day to celebrate 20 incredible years of Extratime. They've brought joy to countless children and families, which is why we were saddened to hear about their upcoming closure. But although this chapter is closing, the incredible legacy and memories the team have created will continue to resonate.

# **Family Support Work**

Family Support Work assist families struggling with issues such as poverty, ill health, learning difficulties, bereavement and break-ups. We're pleased to be providing funding for sporting projects in 2024 – helping relieve family stress and improve relationships.

#### **Farney Close School**

We're proud supporters of Farney Close School, a local independent residential special needs school in Sussex. This year, we funded a whiteboard for a new classroom and continued to contribute to their fundraising efforts, helping to support them through a period of everincreasing costs.

#### **Harry Ragless**

We funded a new trike for 9-year-old Harry from Lancing, who has spina bifida. Harry and his family describe the trike as a release from his wheelchair, allowing him greater freedom to join in with activities and manoeuvre independently.



#### **Hypo Hounds**

We're delighted to support this diabetic alert assistance dog charity. The dogs are assigned to children with type I diabetes and are trained to help prevent potentially life-threatening hypoglycaemic attacks by alerting them when their blood sugars are getting too low. Our donation helped fund an event celebrating what the children have been up to with their dogs, enabling all volunteers and vulnerable clients to be able to attend free of charge.





#### **Momentum**

Momentum help families of seriously ill children. We've provided funding for various projects across Sussex, including providing Christmas gift sacks for supported children and their siblings.

#### **PACSO**

PACSO support children and young people with learning and physical disabilities through afterschool and holiday play opportunities. We have visited this wonderful charity a few times to see their brilliant support system first-hand and are proud to be funding a term of afterschool clubs in 2024.

#### Whoopsadaisy

This lovely small Sussex charity are dedicated to helping children with physical disabilities live as independently as possible. We funded some new equipment to help the children continue building their independence, including some interlocking therapy steps.

It was also heartwarming to read about how Whoopsadaisy helped Chip (pictured below – left and centre), an eight-year-old boy with quadriplegic cerebral palsy, who defied the odds to run the Mini Mile race during the Brighton Marathon weekend in April. Chip started weekly sessions with them when he was six months old and is still using the service today.







#### **Woodlands Meed School**

We were delighted to fund a dedicated sports kit for the children at Woodlands Meed School to attend sports festivals and events – including the 'Play on the Pitch Event' at the Amex Stadium.



#### Wellspring West Sussex

Wellspring are a very useful information resource for families with young children with special needs and disabilities. They run a variety of workshops through their Creative Arts Programme, and our support has enabled them to provide music and drama workshops and family fun days.
